# Rocky Hill Passes \$90 Million Budget, Sets Mill Rate to 34.1

Over \$1 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding and an increase to state aid helped Rocky Hill Town Councilors mitigate tax hikes in the town's second year of COVID, but not enough for unanimous consensus on a near-\$90 million budget.

What separated Council Democrats from their colleagues in the GOP Majority was one-tenth of a Mill. The Mill Rate set by last Monday's budget adoption is 34.1 – up from last year's 33.6.

Among the dissenters in the 7-2 final vote was Democratic Councilor John Emmanuel, who said he was pushing for an even 34.0 – a target he says prompted him to challenge Republicans on the addition of an \$80,000 fulltime emergency management director.

He says it's about maintaining Rocky Hill's competitive edge.

"What we're seeing today, especially with people on fixed incomes, they have a lot of other increases, so we can't just look at it as a stand-alone increase people will accept," Emmanuel said. "When corporations and small businesses look at towns to move to, one of the things they look at is the Mill Rate."

Before Councilors had enough guidance to factor in \$2.9 million in ARPA money, the Mill Rate was heading for 35.6 – as proposed by Town Manager John Mehr months ago.

Driving that was \$300,000 in debt service increases, \$352,000 of inflation built in by union contracts, and a \$1.7 million Board

of Education (BOE) budget hike – the product of COVID-related school operations costs.

The Town Manager was also looking to add enough funding to hire two new police officers, to combat a rash in car break-ins and thefts.

With the ARPA money – and guidance on how to use it – in hand, the town can cover its increases with minimal tax hikes, all while keeping \$1.4 million of the federal money in a special revenue fund for aid to struggling small businesses and nonprofits, said Mayor Lisa Marotta.

"I think it's a prudent budget," added GOP Councilor Jeff Levine. "There's been a lot of work behind the scenes, and I think it's the best compromise for all."

Democrats agreed – almost – but the emergency management director role proved to be a sticking point during a lengthy discussion prior to the vote.

Currently, a member of the Police Department doubles in that role, and while Republicans have lauded his work in the role, they worry about the long-term sustainability of saddling one individual with that much work – especially during a worldwide pandemic.

"The pandemic hit our organization in so many ways and opened our eyes to so many different important things we have to do," said Deputy Mayor Ed Charamut, who chairs the Council's public safety committee. We need a quarterback."

"I think that's a valid concern, that we need to make sure someone has the time to

Where I have concerns is funding a new position," said Democratic Councilor Chris Duff. "Our salaries are obligated. Our debt obligations are already there. We can only really nibble around the edges."

He suggested exploring a regional approach – not unlike entities such as the fourtown Central Connecticut Health District.

But Councilors were advised to steer clear of that model when they consulted with State Homeland Security experts, who recommended a full-time position based on the volume of work in Rocky Hill, according to Marotta.

"If we don't add it to this budget, we're losing another year," Marotta said.

So, Emmanuel turned to the BOE budget, recommending that the Council put a bit more into capital projects – and take out about \$200,000 in operating expenditures.

"Debt is increasing, not including \$10 million needed for BOE facilities renovations over next 5 years," Emmanuel said. "Cuts to their CIP is basically kicking the can down the road." And once the ARPA funds – with their two-year shelf life – run out, the town could be looking at a perfect storm, he said.

His bid to reduce the operational side further, he said, was prompted by Board budget surplus returns to the town side over years prior.

"[Superintendent Dr. [Mark] Zito runs his shop very efficiency," Emmanuel said. "I have confidence they can get by with \$200K less."

Levine and Councilor Alan Greenspan were less certain – they said that their number for the Board was based on conversations with BOE Chair Brian Dillon, and that they weren't comfortable with going lower than what had been hashed out through rigorous expense vetting.

Plus, there's the uncertainty regarding fall COVID safety protocols, Greenspan said.

"We just don't know what next year is going to look like – what our startup costs will be," he said.

# East Windsor Incident Alarms Officials Over Rocky Hill Facility

A reported sexual assault at an East Windsor nursing home has alarmed Rocky Hill lawmakers, who say that they now have security concerns about a local facility run by the same company.

The iCare Health Network-managed skilled nursing home known as 60 West has been the subject of resident scrutiny - not to mention two Town Council lawsuits attempting to prevent its 2013 arrival – because among its patient population are former inmates, including several registered sex offenders.

But Kerry Wood, a state lawmaker who presides over Rocky Hill's 29th House District, says that while she shares resident unease about the facility's location, she's long had the impression - due to regular dialogue with iCare's 60 West management team - that the company could more than handle their most troubled patients.

Then Miguel Lopez, a 50-year-old registered sex offender and patient at Fresh River Nursing Home in East Windsor, barricaded a female staffer in his room and raped her, according to a report published last week in The Connecticut Mirror.

Now, Wood says she has questions.

"I was told they are the best in the business at handling this type of individual, and they clearly are not," Wood said over the phone last Thursday. "With 60 West's proximity to Moser School, there's no room for error here, and the East Windsor incident has blown this wide open."

Wood and State Senator Matt Lesser reached out to Care last week, and the parties are working to schedule a July meeting to discuss the lawmakers' concerns.

In an emailed statement delivered Friday, iCare spokesperson David Skoczulek stood behind the company's security protocols, which he says align with all state and federal nursing home safety guidelines.

He would not go into specifics regarding the Lopez case, as it is still under investigation.

"Every resident admitted to an iCare center is extensively evaluated prior to admission for their clinical and psycho-social needs, often by an on-site evaluation and interview by a trained RN," he wrote. With their consent or the consent of their guardian, the resident is then placed at the nursing center and on the nursing unit best suited for their care needs and safety. This could be a secure, locked memory care or behavioral health unit or otherwise."

The East Windsor incident, The Mirror wrote, exposes a reporting loophole - although iCare typically notifies State Police when it accepts a sex offender from out-of-state, they are not required to by law.

This time, according to The Mirror's report, that didn't happen.

"It is the legal obligation of the resident themselves or their legal guardian to update the sex offender registry as to their current location," Skoczulek wrote. "While there is no legal obligation for a nursing home to inform the registry, we do take steps to assist the resident or their guardian in doing so and prompt them to do in a timely fashion."

Lopez is from Massachusetts, and he's not the first transfer from out of state - Level 3 sex offender and ex-Massachusetts inmate Wayne Chapman reportedly bounced between the South Hampton Street homeless shelter, Boston Medical Center, and a Medford nursing home before arriving at 60 West late last year.

While the loophole needs to be closed - and quickly the real crux of the matter is iCare's security protocols, Wood says.

"We're talking about a matter of paperwork here, and that's easily fixed," she said. "But this was a horrific act, and I don't know how someone being on a registry is going to prevent it. What if you or I had a parent or relative rehabbing in there from a knee or hip surgery, and there's someone like this in the room next door?'

In East Windsor, the admittance of a 50-year-old to the nursing home has raised questions. iCare says that its facilities serve individuals with chronic conditions - debilitating or otherwise - regardless of age, as both Connecticut and federal law permit them to.

They must be physically, mentally or cognitively impaired to a degree where they require 24/7 care in a nursing home environment," Skoczulek. "Age is not a factor, but serious and significant cognitive impairment is."

While Connecticut state statute lays out similar criteria - for those with "uncontrolled and/or unstable chronic conditions requiring continuous skilled nursing services" - it also allows skilled nursing homes to admit those with

"controlled and/or stable chronic conditions which require minimal skilled nursing services, nursing supervision, or assistance with personal care on a daily basis".

Connecticut skilled nursing facilities are also authorized to accept those "suffering from manageable psychiatric conditions".

That proposition becomes more controversial when it comes to former inmates - particularly those with Chapman's or Lopez's type of criminal record.

In 2017, 60 West was the first nursing home in the country to secure federal Medicaid reimbursement eligibility, and the facility - which was spotlighted in U.S. News & World Report in 2018 as a top nursing home - has been hailed as a flagship operation for a state looking to handle long term care for elderly and disabled inmates outside the corrections system.

Any Connecticut Department of Corrections (DOC) referrals, according to a 2017 CT Health Investigative team report, must be deemed physically incapable of posing a threat.

But then there are the out-of-state referral cases such as Lopez and Chapman – not uncommon, iCare says, due to the regional scope of their network.

A pair of independent "qualified examiners" in Massachusetts deemed Chapman no longer a threat based on his physical condition - Chapman suffers from Parkinson's but Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker told reporters 3 years ago that he wants a more thorough examination that includes his mental state.

According to the Connecticut Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services, 60 West has both a secure cognitive impairment and open long term care unit - but no secure behavioral unit.

Now Rocky Hill lawmakers want a more thorough examination of iCare's in-facility security measures. Wood says that when her and Lesser do meet with them, they plan to push for a future public forum.

"I will highly encourage them to have a public forum on what they're doing at 60 West St. to reassure neighbors in Rocky Hill and people that have children at Moser School that they are running that facility in a way that will ensure what happened in East Windsor will never happen here,' Wood said.

# **Central Connecticut Health District Celebrates 25 Years**

The Central Connecticut Health District (CCHD) wrapped up a year like no other by celebrating its 25th year in existence – and the Rocky Hill Town Council joined in, with a proclamation of gratitude.

That was presented to CCHD representatives at the Council's June 7 regular meeting, with Rocky Hill – like most Connecticut municipalities – in the home stretch of its year and a half-long bout with COVID.

"CCHD really stepped up," said Deputy Mayor Gail Budrejko. "After 25 years of service, this past year and a half has been the most unique and memorable. [But] you can't characterize your service with just this one event, so I'd like to thank you and congratulate you on 25 years, and here's to 25 more." The CCHD serves Newington, Wethersfield, Rocky Hill, and Berlin.

It was first launched in 1996 as a joint endeavor between Rocky Hill and Wethersfield. Berlin joined two years later, and the CCHD got its official name.

Newington came aboard in 2006.

"Thank you for allowing us to be able to serve the town," said CCHD Executive Director Charles Brown. "It's been our honor and privilege to serve all 4 of our communities the past 25 years, and I look forward to the next 25." The CCHD fulfills a sprawling list of public health roles that includes clean drinking water, restaurant inspections, mental health support, asthma prevention, and opioid epidemic response organizing.

But the past year and a half's battle with COVID-19 shifted CCHD's focus to vaccinations – both obtaining them from the state, and working with local level partners to run the near-40 clinics held across all 4 District towns in 2021.

"We've always known what a great partner you are to us – the lead, asthma, and community awareness you do," said Mayor Beth DelBuono. "This past year, while challenging, really drew our attention to the strength of your organization and the collaboration with our town on such a regular basis. This is a really fitting tribute."

Brown said that CCHD is keeping up the vaccination effort by getting shots to hard-to-reach homebound residents.

Newington Councilor Tim Manke, who volunteered at the CCHD's clinics, says he witnessed the District's work firsthand.

"I was impressed with the professionalism and the caring and compassion they showed their clients," Manke said. "I wish you success for another 25 years, but hopefully things can calm down."

# **Councilors Discuss Obstacles to Returning In-Person**

Local officials are eyeing a return to inperson government meetings, but new state FOI requirements has left some complications to sort through, they say.

The rules – laid out in House Bill 6448 – reflect a desire to retain the kind of electronic access that enabled municipal governments to hold virtual meetings and the public to attend them, but it comes with a host of new mandates the town is awaiting clearer guidance on, said Town Clerk James Krupienski.

"It's going to be a bumpy ride the next two months getting this all worked out," Krupienski said at the Town Council's June 22 regular meeting.

Under the Bill, municipal governments retain the option to hold virtual – as well as hybrid – meetings until April 22 of next year.

Perhaps the most significant challenge, Krupienski says, is a requirement that municipalities provide devices – and a location from which to livestream local government meetings – to residents that request it, though federal COVID relief should help cover related costs, at least for now.

He says they're still sifting through the details, but House Bill 664's 21-page analysis indicates that the mandate would only apply if the Town chooses to continue with meetings that are virtual-only.

"If a public agency holds a meeting (other than an executive session or emergency special meeting) solely by electronic equipment, then it must provide any member of the public with (1) a physical location and electronic equipment needed to attend the meeting in real-time, if requested in writing at least 24 hours before the meeting, and (2) the same opportunities to comment, testify, or otherwise participate that he or she would have for an in-person meeting. However, the bill specifies that it does not require public agencies to offer any of these participation opportunities to members of the public attending electronically if they are not legally required to do so for members of the public attending in person

The evening of June 22, local leaders celebrated the Central Connecticut Health District's 25th anniversary, while praising them for the vaccination effort that has helped knock Newington's COVID infection rates down to the lowest they've been in over a year.

And, with Town Hall reopened and departments returning to full-fledged in-person staff meetings, Councilor Chris Miner, as he has for the past several months, asked when the full Council might be able to reconvene in its traditional venue.

That depends on how quickly they can work out the logistics, said Town Manager Keith Chapman. "It is a monster of a project," Chapman said.

For Councilor and Newington Community Television (NCTV) President John Donahue, the lion's share will be obtaining new equipment for a better meeting night livestream – NCTV has been broadcasting the Council's Zoom-only meetings via You-Tube throughout the pandemic, but must now adapt for delivering a hybrid experience.

That hit some complications more recently, when an equipment order was delayed 10 weeks, Donahue told his fellow Councilors.

"I'm hoping it's not 10 weeks," he said. "If we really need to get back into the Chamber, we'll go old school – throw a camera in the back of the room and record it that way."

For all its convenience, Zoom can get challenging when one's internet connection doesn't cooperate – something Miner himself has been able to attest on more than one occasion.

Under the new FOI legislation, a dropped virtual participant can derail an entire meeting – for 30 minutes, if the individual is the difference between having a quorum and not, according to Krupienski.

"Even if you brought them back on two minutes later, you have to wait 30 minutes. And if the quorum isn't reached within 2 hours, you have to adjourn," Krupienski said. "If we lose that connectivity, we're losing our meetings."

For all its stated complications, area municipal governments have been returning to their respective Council Chambers – both Rocky Hill and Wethersfield held their first in-person government meetings the week prior.

The device and livestreaming location requirement should be a permitted use under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), allowing Newington to fulfill that obligation outside of its operating budget – for the grant's two-year lifespan, at least – according to Town Finance Director Janet Murphy.

"This is a funded mandate," Miner said. "We have the funds to do this. We need to just do it."

Town resident Rose Lyons, a longtime regular at meetings – in-person or otherwise – agreed.

While she doesn't have a laptop device, she usually calls in.

"It's been over a year since we've been together in the room," Lyons said during last Tuesday's public comments segment. "They're going to be talking about changes to Newington Junction, and there's got to be a way to bring that to the public. I'm asking that you please, please give it top priority to get us back up and running."

# **Consultants Present Possible School Facilities Upgrade Plan**

A recommended plan for upgrading school facilities would close Charles Wright, while renovating – or reconstructing – the district's four other elementary buildings.

The scenario – presented by consultants from Colliers International and SLR Consulting as the frontrunner among 4 tentative approaches – would involve constructing a new, larger Highcrest, as well as Hamner.

Emerson Williams and Webb would undergo renovations.

"Our schools are in good shape. They're safe, but they're behind and not in line with the learning needs of right now," said Board of Education (BOE) member John Cascio.

As chair of the Board's facilities committee, Cascio has been part of this conversation for quite some time. The district had SLR conduct an enrollment study two years ago as part of a broader needs assessment – back when consultants projected a \$31 million cost just to maintain the buildings at status quo.

If the BOE takes Colliers' and SLR's advice, work at all four buildings would be done, in phases, over the course of an estimated 10-year timeframe – to the tune of between \$81 million and \$84 million, after state aid is factored in, Chuck Warrington of Colliers told the Board last Tuesday.

"It's a lot, but it's not gonna happen tomorrow," Cascio said. "We're planning for the future, and we want to make this a community project."

Whichever path the Board decides to take, the community will have the final say – the plan needs referendum approval before shovels can hit the ground.

What's Happening

It'll take a year of work just to prepare for a school construction reimbursement application – due to the State Department of Education (SDE) by June 30 of 2022.

That means the drafting education specifications – a detailed needs overview that will help the project team fine tune the budget and apply for the grants – as well as conducting onsite geotechnical work to root out any environmental cost multipliers.

"This is due diligence stuff," Warrington said. "Making sure there's no budget busters – like high rock or groundwater under there."

But the larger part of the community project Cascio described will likely be introducing the idea of redistricting – a touchy topic, given the anticipated disruption.

"This doesn't necessarily mean only kids at Chares Wright are impacted," said Patrick Gallagher of SLR. "There'd need to be other moves at other schools to make sure [the enrollment distribution] is balanced."

When SLR last ran enrollment projections for Wethersfield, they forecast stability. By their latest estimate, the town will see slight growth by the late 2020's – to just under 2,000 elementary level students.

In an alternative version of the Charles Wright elimination scheme – devised for 473-525 students per school – the district loses between 150 and 175 seats of capacity.

It's a plan consultants laid out with a word of caution. "It'd be very tight over the ten-year period, especially

with that slow growth," Gallagher said. "We have some concerns this scenario may have some risks associated with it from a capacity stand-point."

Under the recommended plan, Charles Wright would grow to be able to accommodate between 630 to 700 students, while the other elementary buildings would hit the 473-525 capacity.

Another scenario involves retaining Charles Wright and overhauling all 5 schools – specifically, renovating Wright, Webb, and Williams, while reconstructing Hamner and Highcrest.

It's also the most expensive scheme, according to Gallagher.

Another draw to the recommended plan is swing space, consultants and district leaders say.

Taking Highcrest offline – and constructing a new building on the largest school parcel in town – allows the district to use the existing facility as swing space for when Emerson Williams is renovated, Gallagher said.

It would also, in a subsequent phase, accommodate Webb students, when that building gets renovated.

Superintendent of Schools Michael Emmett says the approach was informed by the district's experience with the Wethersfield High School (WHS) renovation project, which was done in phases.

He also says he'd like to avoid a portable classroom scenario.

"Phases never finished on time. We found a significant amount of hazardous material that could only be abated when students weren't in the building, and we had a lot of disruption," Emmett said. "This plan looks to minimize that."

# Central Connecticut Health District Celebrates 25 Years

The Central Connecticut Health District (CCHD) wrapped up a year like no other by celebrating its 25th year in existence – and the Rocky Hill Town Council joined in, with a proclamation of gratitude.

That was presented to CCHD representatives at the Council's June 7 regular meeting, with Rocky Hill – like most Connecticut municipalities – in the home stretch of its year and a half-long bout with COVID.

"CCHD really stepped up," said Deputy Mayor Gail Budrejko. "After 25 years of service, this past year and a half has been the most unique and memorable. [But] you can't characterize your service with just this one event, so I'd like to thank you and congratulate you on 25 years, and here's to 25 more."

The CCHD serves Newington, Wethersfield, Rocky Hill, and Berlin.

It was first launched in 1996 as a joint endeavor between Rocky Hill and Wethersfield. Berlin joined two years later, and the CCHD got its official name.

Newington came aboard in 2006.

"Thank you for allowing us to be able to serve the town," said CCHD Executive Director Charles Brown. "It's been our honor and privilege to serve all 4 of our communities the past 25 years, and I look forward to the next 25." The CCHD fulfills a sprawling list of public health roles that includes clean drinking water, restaurant inspections, mental health support, asthma prevention, and opioid epidemic response organizing.

But the past year and a half's battle with COVID-19 shifted CCHD's focus to vaccinations – both obtaining them from the state, and working with local level partners to run the near-40 clinics held across all 4 District towns in 2021.

"We've always known what a great partner you are to us – the lead, asthma, and community awareness you do," said Mayor Beth DelBuono. "This past year, while challenging, really drew our attention to the

strength of your organization and the collaboration with our town on such a regular basis. This is a really fitting tribute."

Brown said that CCHD is keeping up the vaccination effort by getting shots to hard-to-reach homebound residents.

Newington Councilor Tim Manke, who volunteered at the CCHD's clinics, says he witnessed the District's work firsthand.

"I was impressed with the professionalism and the caring and compassion they showed their clients," Manke said. "I wish you success for another 25 years, but hopefully things can calm down."



# Board of Education Discusses Fall Re-Opening Plan

What's Happening

It's summer in Wethersfield, but school district officials are already thinking about fall reopening plans – and Superintendent Michael Emmett says he expects it to be a moving target once again.

"This will absolutely, positively change. I guarantee it," Emmett told the Board of Education (BOE) at its June 22 regular meeting.

For now, the district is sticking with 6-foot social distancing – wherever feasible – as well as the classroom cohorts that got them through the 2020-2021 school year.

Measures such as handwashing and

sanitation, presumably, will remain best practice in September, Emmett said.

Mask-on policies remain in place – per Governor Lamont's executive orders for schools. That expires July 20, after which COVID safety protocols are anyone's guess, Emmett says.

"We're waiting on the CDC, as to what the mitigation strategy will look like," he said.

He expects it to include responsibility for contact tracing, as was the case this past year – but Emmett sees cutting the isolation time from 10 days to 7, with a chance to test out after Day 5.

"Right now, the tests are very easy to

come by, and we don't want to see our kids quarantine any longer than they have to," he said.

Those that have been fully vaccinated will not be required to quarantine upon potential exposure, Emmett said.

As of his update to the Board, 91 percent of Wethersfield residents 65 and over had been fully vaccinated, and the town, like almost all Connecticut communities, was well out of the State DPH's red alert infection tier.

The district saw 332 cases this past year, between students and staff, but the infection origins were largely found to have been out of school. Students ages 12-17 joined those eligible for the vaccine back in May.

"We've also seen that the impact of the vaccination has been profound," Emmett said. "The last date we had a staff member test positive was April 26, and we saw a significant reduction among students."

State and local officials hope to see Pfizer and Moderna vaccines approved for the youngest age groups by sometime in September.

"We've certainly seen a robust number of students get the vaccine, so we think we're in a good position to make changes to this document as we move through the summer," Emmett said.

# State Rep. Morrin Bello Touts Biennial State Budget

State Representative Amy Morrin Bello (D-Wethersfield) last month touted the \$46.4 billion biennial state budget with a \$2.3 billion surplus approved by the House of Representatives and the State Senate that is expected to help jumpstart the economy, provide support for nonprofits, protect working families and invest in cities and towns, without new taxes.

"As a freshman legislator, I have listened to my constituents about their priorities including, strengthening our economy and protecting our working families," said Rep. Morrin Bello. "I am grateful to my colleagues on the Finance and Appropriations Committees who worked tirelessly to bring forward a bill that helps our residents and supports our municipalities."

Beginning July 1, 2022, for FY 2022 under the Edu-

cation Cost Sharing formula, Wethersfield will receive \$11,540,764, and in FY 2023 \$12,196,352.

In addition, Wethersfield will receive \$266,038 in "PILOT" funds in both fiscal years, as well grants under the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Fund, Non-Education Aid and Adult Education aid for a total town aid of \$11,989603 in FY 22 and \$12,645,429 in FY 23.

Morrin Bello said, "Our communities, including small businesses, families, students, frontline workers, essential and non-essential employees all have felt the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in different ways. I am proud of the work we put into this budget that delivers the resources needed to turn the corner and move toward a much brighter future for all."

Rep. Morrin Bello also highlighted provisions in the

budget bill that include:

Tax relief for restaurants and allowing certain businesses to keep 13.6% of the 7.35% sales tax they collect on sales of meals and beverages for FY 22

An increase in the state's earned income tax credit to 30.5% of the federal credit


